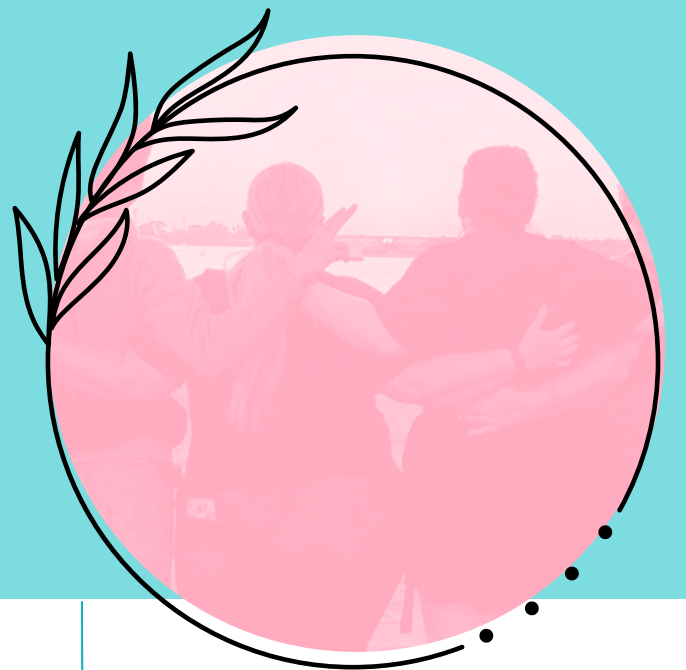

Our Successes

This season, we surveyed Grace House Residents, Grace House Graduates, and former Grace House Residents on the subject of the effectiveness of the Grace House Residential Program. We are so proud of these findings:

1. 100% of program participants stated that Grace House improved their readiness for living independently on their own.
2. 100% of program participants stated that staying at Grace House improved their self-esteem.
3. Of the many services offered at Grace House, the services held in the highest regard by clients have been peer support, job and life skills, and being able to save money in a rent free environment.
4. Of the goals survivors achieved at Grace House, staying sober, saving money, and gaining emotional healing were the most attainable goals they could achieve at Grace house.
5. Without Grace House, more than half of program participants would not be able to leave exploitation by themselves.
